COMPUTER ZONE INTRODUCES ZERO PERCENT FINANCING FOR PRACTICES SEEKING ARRA INCENTIVES

New Financing Program Enables Practices to Get Started on Meeting Meaningful Use Requirements by Purchasing EMR Now
